Formerly an occupational and then clinical psychologist, for more than 10 years Jennifer has developed a programme of research studying assessment and performance in medical education with a particular interest in identifying and addressing under performance.

Dr Stephen Yule, Assistant Professor of Surgery, Harvard Medical School, Director of Education and Research, STRATUS Center for Medical Simulation. Stephen is an academic psychologist with expertise in organizational psychology and human factors science. His research studies the assessment of non-technical skills and patient safety in surgery.

Dr Carol-Anne Moulton, Associate Professor, University of Toronto and Staff Surgeon with the Division of General Surgery, University Health Network. Her clinical practice is in the field of hepato-biliary surgical oncology. She is appointed as Scientist at the Wilson Centre undertaking a programme of research studying surgical judgement and the social psychology of surgeons.
